HOW TO CHOOSE THE APPROPRIATE LEVEL FOR GRADE 10:

- ♦ Talk with classroom teachers/parents/counsellors.
- How well have I done this year at a given level? The '<u>rule of thumb'</u> is that you should be achieving the provincial standard at any level, if you plan to continue at that level. For example, you should be getting **70% or** higher (level 3 or 4) if you plan to continue at the same level next year.
- ♦ In order to be prepared for future destinations, **students should pick courses at the level** they can be successful at. (**Success = achieving at least a level 3**).
- ♦ It is the most beneficial to take English and History at the same level and Math and Science at the same level. Refer to website under "Course Selections" regarding Math, Science and English choices.
- Students thinking of moving from Essential Grade 9 to Applied Grade 10 or Applied Grade 9 to Academic Grade 10 will have gaps in their learning. Seventy percent of the content, however, is the same between applied and academic. Student should consult with their subject specific teacher to see if they should go directly into the new grade ten level or take the course at the new grade nine level first. It is recommended that students going from essential to applied math should take the grade 9 applied math before trying the grade 10.
- Note that 70 % of the course content is the same between Academic and Applied, but the amount of work and the higher order of thinking in Academic requires greater commitment and focus on the part of the student.
